Dr Annie McCluskey *PhD MA DipCOT FOTARA*
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Annie McCluskey is a registered occupational therapist, implementation scientist, health services researcher, educator, private practitioner, mentor and board director. She has received over \$4 million in research funding, published 75 peer-reviewed papers with an *h*-index of 22, and over 2000 citations. Her research and teaching focus on translating evidence into practice, in addition to the feasibility, acceptability and effectiveness of rehabilitation treatments to improve participation of stroke survivors and older adults. Her research investigates community outings and travel habits, driving, scooter use, handwriting, self-care and sexuality.



Since 2003, Annie has been a co-director of the OTseeker evidence database (www.otseeker.com), which contains over 10,000 records relevant to occupational therapy. In 2011, Annie established the StrokeEd collaboration with Karl Schurr, providing evidence-based workshops to improve the skills, knowledge and practice of neuro-rehabilitation therapists, and influence the delivery of physical rehabilitation services to stroke survivors.



In 2017, Annie became an inaugural Fellow of the Occupational Therapy Australia Research Academy (FOTARA), recognising a sustained and outstanding contribution to research and scholarship. In 2019, she received the award of 'Supervisor of the Year' in the Faculty of Health Sciences, at the University of Sydney.

In 2020, Annie's partner Karl Schurr became seriously ill with COVID-19 while overseas. Together they embarked on a journey of rehabilitation and recovery, and have shared their lived experience of COVID-19 as health professionals at conferences, on TV, radio and social media.
